2012: Drafting phase for the revised edition

2013: Consultation procedure (consultation web page)

**December 2013**: Publication V.2



# Main drivers for update

#### Content

- Checking compliance with exposure scenario, with advice on scaling
- Communication of information on mixtures

#### Structure

- Streamlining the guidance, with more readable and user-friendly text
- Avoid duplication with documents published since 2008
- Delete out-of-date information
