



# 2017 Rolling Work Plan (RWP)

for the Memorandum of Understanding concerning technical cooperation between the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) and Environment and Climate Change Canada / Health Canada

This document describes the 2017 work activities planned by ECHA and Environment and Climate Change Canada / Health Canada under the RWP in the implementation of the above mentioned Memorandum of Understanding

## Topics identified for exchange of information in 2017:

## Canada:

- Overall Status / update & renewal of Canada's Chemicals Management Plan (CMP)
- Results from risk assessment and management
- Information collection and management tools
- Sharing of regulatory approaches

#### ECHA:

- Program updates (CoRAP, SVHC, Dissemination, Regulatory Strategy)
- Regulatory Information Technology tools
- Nanomaterials
- Risk management

## Means of cooperation envisioned in 2017:

- Ad hoc communication/sharing of information on technical topics, chemical information, technical approaches and guidance documents of interest
- Missions to each other's institutions, where possible, or meetings scheduled around other events, e.g.
  Helsinki Chemicals Forum, OECD meetings
- Use of other technologies, Webex, Webinars, Workshops etc.

## **Scheduled information Exchange**

- March: Planning Call for Spring computational prioritisation workshop
- March/April: Call to discuss Risk Management Priorities
- May: ECHA-Canada MoU Directors steering group videoconference
- Spring/Summer: ECHA-Canada-US workshop on computational prioritisation of chemicals
- June: Meetings in the margins of ECHA's 10th anniversary and Helsinki Chemicals Forum
- June: Meeting alongside the 56th OECD Joint Meeting
- August: OECD workshop hosted by Canada on Socioeconomic Analysis /Cost Benefit Analysis information sharing on valuation studies in progress
- October: ECHA-Canada MoU Directors steering group videoconference
