REACH-EN-FORCE-1

Results of the prolongation of the first coordinated Forum enforcement project

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Introduction

- Topic: (pre) registration and provisions of Safety Data Sheets
- Almost 800 companies were inspected in the period May 2010 – April 2011
- Inspectors in 19 Member States (MSs) of the Economic European Area participated
- The project was guided in the same way by a Working Group which developed a project manual and web based questionnaire as the project in 2009
- In each MS a national coordinator was appointed, who was responsible for the training of the inspectors and the coordination and supervision of the project




Participation and number of inspections

- The number of inspections per MS varies from 1 till 289 (total number of inspections 791)
- 764 inspections covered the full scope of the project; 45 inspections were focussed just on checking SDSs

Type of companies inspected




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Role of the company under REACH

In 774 of the completed questionnaires the role of the inspected company was reported





Registration obligations


- 472 companies produce or import phase-in-substances <u>as</u> <u>such</u> and 203 companies produce or import substances <u>in</u> <u>preparations</u> (> 1 tonne/year)
- The inspected companies in total pre-registered about 35,015 substances
- There is a wide range in number of pre-registrations of the inspected companies:
 - 372 companies pre-registrated 1-10 substances,
 - > 179 11-100 substances,
 - 46 101-1000 and 4 > 1000 substances



Registration obligations

In 238 cases exemptions from the obligation to register were reported (in 322 cases there were no exemptions)

Most important exemptions:





Registration obligations: non-compliances

- In 23 cases no (pre-)registration had been submitted
- In 9 cases the content of the pre-registration was not correct
- Non-compliance with registration obligations 32 cases (~ 4%)



SDS obligations (1)

Availability of SDSs

- 623 inspected companies (out of 757 responses) had the required SDSs
- In the case of 67 <u>companies</u> (9%) the required SDSs were not or partially available
- During these inspections 1,969 <u>products</u> were checked; in these cases 379 SDSs were not available



SDS obligations (2)


Requirements of Articles 31(5) and 31(6)

- 493 companies (747 responses) fulfilled the requirements of the Articles 31(5) (official language) and 31(6) (dated and 16 headings)
- For 119 companies (16%) the prescribed requirements were not correct
- 366 (~ 21%) of the 1,711 checked SDSs were not correct



Infringements

- Non-compliance with the REACH obligations was observed within 20% of the inspected companies
- Infringements: measures taken:




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Infringements: follow up

Conclusions

- The prolongation phase of the project is considered to be a success story.
- Ensured coordinated enforcement activities in the MS between the finalisation of first phase of REF-1 and the operational phase of REF-2
- Ensured follow-up actions from first REF-1 phase and to deal with 800 inspections
- Further activities related to REF-1 have been carried out in MSs



Conclusions

- As a whole REF-1 is the first project coordinated by Forum with the aim to harmonize the enforcement approach in the EU and EEA countries.
- Very essential requirements of the REACH Regulation have been covered (pre-reg and SDS).
- Wide participation in the EU-EEA (most countries participated) and a large number of inspections carried out (> 2600).
- The project as a successful kick-off of one of the main activities of the Forum,
- Promotes the establishment of an equal playing level field.
- The project as a basis for future projects.
- Allows to draw up important lessons and conclusions. Some of them already implemented in REF-2.



Conclusions

Important messages to industry:

- Forum is working, cooperation between MS shows to be efficient, harmonised approach followed in MS, many resources deployed in the MS to ensure equal level playing field.
- To draw attention: substances can be unlawfully manufactured or imported (supported by the +/- 3 % not (pre)-registered)!
- SDS to improve because basic requirements non-compliant in 20 % cases. These will certainly be key area(s) for inspectors in the following years
