

REACH – Annex XVII PAH restrictions

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Project Background

♦ REACH annex XVII, restriction 50 entered into force 1 January 2010:

- Limits the amount of PAHs:
 - in extender oils placed on the market in Europe, or used for the production of tyres
 - In tyres placed on the market in Europe



EU Project Timeline

- ◆ December 2009 (Forum 6) –1st pan-European enforcement project on a restriction agreed
- January 2010 research started
- ⇒ June 2010 (Forum 7) UK presented an enforcement manual
- ⇒ July 2010 onwards enforcement work



EU Project Timeline

March 2011 (Forum 8) – UK presented findings of UK campaign and issues identified

October 2011 – some campaigns complete, others on-going

Next steps – gather data, collate report, project conclusion



Project Aims

Protect people and the environment

Assess compliance with the restriction

Raise awareness of the restrictions

Take action on non-compliances



UK Campaign: Compliance Assessment

- Information notices extender oil producers, tyre manufacturers & imported
- Audits of tyre manufacturers assessed procedures for compliance
- ◆ IP346 analysis extender oils used to manufacture tyres in the UK
- ♦ ISO 21461 analysis tyres



UK Campaign: Awareness Raising

- Aim: ensure relevant businesses:
 - know about the restriction
 - understand what they need to do to comply
- Suidance UK a global focal point
- Trade associations
- Brityrex tyre trade show
- Magazine & journal articles



Other Member States: Overview

- Enforcement work:
 - Working with customs to assess imported tyres
 - Inspection of tyre manufacturers, importers, distributors and retailers
 - Inspection of rubber mixers
 - Analysis of tyres
 - Requests for information from tyre industry
 - Cascade of information through trade associations



Compliance Assessment: Findings

- Combination of different approaches to assessing compliance
- Different aspects of the supply chain assessed
- No evidence of non-compliance found so far
- ◆ BUT there are challenges and issues in assessing compliance!



Issues & Challenges

- Understanding the restriction:
 - Different viewpoints enforcement, industry, legal
 - Difference between SVHC's & the restriction
 - Responsibility for compliance



Issues & Challenges

- Assessing compliance
 - No visual tyre marking
 - Complexity of the tyre market
 - Cascade of information down the supply chain
 - Declarations



Issues & Challenges

- Analysis
 - Methods stated in the restriction
 - Limited laboratories
 - High cost
 - Alternative methods
 - ◆ IP346 suitability
