## Main expertise in summary

Ms Deim has been involved in chemicals management since 2004, when Hungary joined the EU and she became member of the Hungarian negotiating team on REACH. By now, she has in-depth knowledge of REACH, CLP, PIC and Biocides and chemicals management at national, EU and international level. She has long-term management experience, including setting up new structures, developing yearly strategies, identifying priorities, coordination of work and training of people.

## Professional experience

Currently, Ms Deim is head of department for chemical safety and competent authorities in the National Public Health Center (NPHC) of Hungary. Ms Deim is responsible for the management of the day-to-day work of the REACH, CLP and Biocides Competent Authorities, the PIC DNA, and other chemical safety related matters, including international issues, strategies, legislation, coordination of enforcement, awareness raising and keeping contact with industry representatives. NPHC is the successor of the former Hungarian National Institute of Chemical Safety, which Ms Deim joined at the end of 2007 as head of department for Competent Authorities. Later she was appointed as the deputy director general of the Institute. She was member of ECHA's Member State Committee, Forum and HelpNet. From 2011, she chaired the Forum for 2 consecutive terms. Also in 2011, under the Hungarian Presidency of the EU Council, she chaired the WPIEI-Chemicals.

Her previous work experience includes the Ministry of Finance and the Ministry of Environment of Hungary, with international work experience, as well. In the Ministry of Environment she was responsible for the coordination of the Hungarian position on the environmental acquis for the screening negotiations with the view to Hungary's accession to the EU and she also participated in the screening negotiations. Her tasks involved providing expert advice related to EU affairs and EC law.
