 - Notification according to Article 4(4)







BPR

Biocidal products should be subject to authorisation

- by CA for making available on the market and use within the territory of a Member State,
 or
- by the COM for making available on the market and use within the Union,

to ensure that only biocidal products that comply with the BPR are made available on the market.






