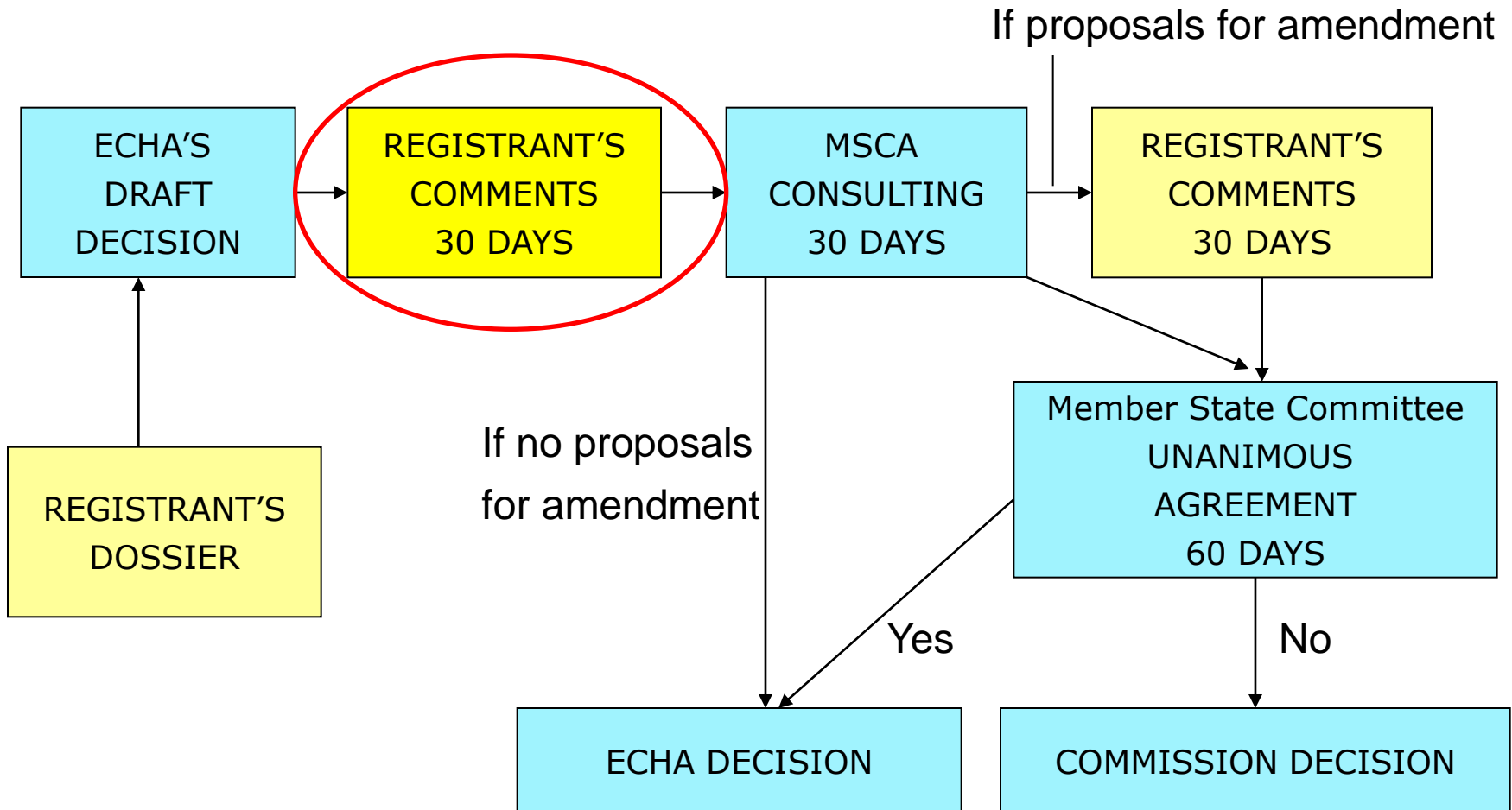



# Types of Compliance Check (CCH)

## Full Compliance Check

1. Substance ID CCH\*
2. Hazard Information
3. Properties and fate
4. Chemical Safety Report

## Targeted Compliance Check (tCCH)

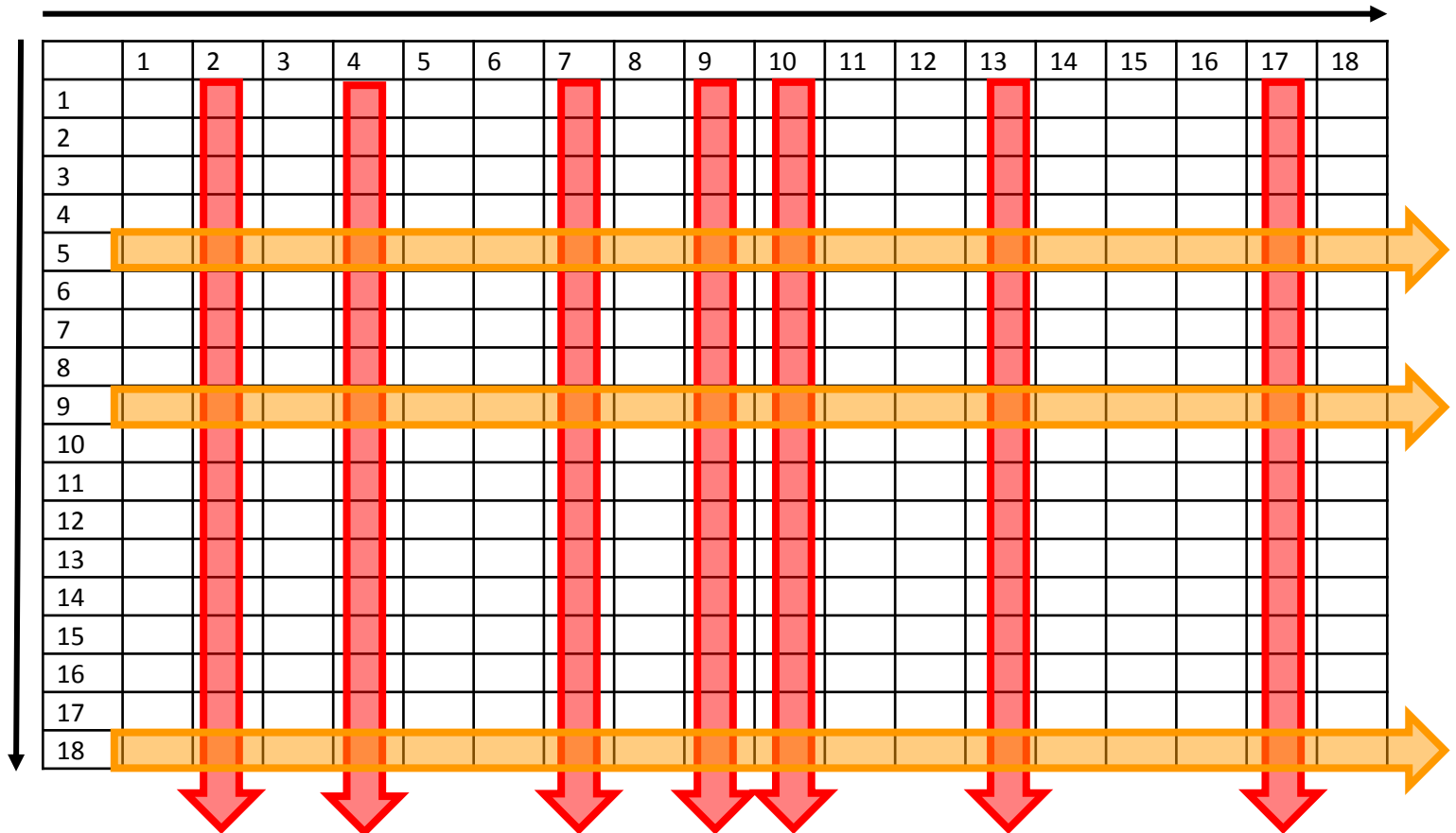
1. Concern driven
2. Typical shortcomings
3. Prioritised endpoints
  - Substance identity
  - PBT related properties
  - Information for selected hazards
  - Classification and labelling

# Important details of CCH decision-making

- For targeted compliance check cases these webinars offered instead of informal communication with ECHA for full compliance check cases
  - **Because:** The targeted compliance check draft decision is less complex than for a full compliance check
- Dossier gets only compliant when the new information has been submitted in an updated dossier
  - **Because:** A comment with the required information is not sufficient to get the dossier into compliance
- Dossier updates can be taken into account until referring the draft decision to MSCAs
  - **Because:** The decision making process involves parties in 28 Member States across the EU
