Minutes of the 53rd meeting of the Committee for Socio-economic Analysis

30 November-3 December and 7-8 December 2021

I. Summary Record of the Proceeding 1) Welcome

María Ottati, Chair of the Committee for Socio-economic Analysis (SEAC), ECHA, welcomed the participants to the 53rd meeting of SEAC.

The Chair informed the participants that the meeting would not be recorded. The list of attendees is given in Part III of the minutes.

2) Adoption of the Agenda

The Chair introduced the final draft agenda of SEAC-53. The agenda was adopted with minor modifications (in line with SEAC/A/53/2021rev1). The Chair mentioned that the meeting would be partly chaired by the Deputy Chair Kalle Kivelä.

The final agenda is attached to these minutes as Annex III. The list of all meeting documents is attached to these minutes as Annex I.

3) Declarations of conflicts of interest to the Agenda

The Chair requested members and their advisors participating in the meeting to declare any conflicts of interest to any of the specific agenda items. Five members declared potential conflicts of interest to the substance-related discussions under the Agenda Items 5.2b-2), 5.2b-4) and 5.2b-5). These members did not participate in voting under those Agenda Items, as stated in Article 9(2) of the SEAC Rules of Procedure.

The Chair and Deputy Chair declared their absence of conflict of interest for all items of SEAC-53 plenary meeting.

The list with declared conflicts of interest is given in Annex II of these minutes.

4) General SEAC procedures

a) Report on SEAC-52 action points and written procedures

The Chair informed the participants that all action points of SEAC-52 had been completed or would be followed up during the on-going SEAC-53 meeting.

The Chair also informed the Committee that the final minutes of SEAC-52 had been adopted by written procedure and had been uploaded to S-CIRCABC as well as on the ECHA website. The Chair thanked members for providing comments on the draft SEAC-52 minutes. She also informed SEAC that that due to the holiday period, the draft minutes would be made available for comments a bit later than normal, in January 2022.

Representatives of the Commission updated the Committee on SEAC-related developments in the REACH Committee and in CARACAL. The Commission also provided an update from the workshops on review of REACH authorisation and restriction processes held in November.

5) Restrictions

5.1 General restriction issues a) The role of SEAC's opinion in the decision-making phase

The Committee took note of the presentation from the Commission regarding the decisionmaking phase for restriction proposals, including the role of SEAC's opinion.

5.2 Restriction Annex XV dossiers

a) Conformity check and key issues discussion

1) Substances containing polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs) in clay targets for shooting

The Chair welcomed the Dossier Submitter's representatives from ECHA and the RAC rapporteurs. She informed the participants that the restriction dossier had been submitted in October 2021.

The Dossier Submitter's representatives then provided an introductory presentation on the restriction proposal. Members and an accompanying expert to a regular stakeholder observer asked clarifying questions on the Dossier Submitter presentation. The Chair informed the participants that RAC had concluded that the dossier conforms to the Annex XV requirements at RAC-59.

The SEAC rapporteurs then presented the outcome of the conformity check and the recommendations to the Dossier Submitter.

The Committee agreed that the dossier conforms to the Annex XV requirements. In addition, the rapporteurs presented the key issues that they have identified for the evaluation of the restriction proposal. The Chair informed the Committee that the Consultation on this restriction proposal will be launched on 22 December 2021.

b) Opinion development

1) 2,4-dinitrotoluene – First draft opinion (not for discussion in this meeting)

No discussions were held at SEAC-53 due to the application of a simplified opinion development approach on this case. The members were requested to provide written comments on the first draft opinion (which was made available for consultation prior to the plenary) by 14 January 2022. The rapporteur will prepare the second draft opinion for discussion at SEAC-54 in March 2022.

2) 1,6,7,8,9,14,15,16,17,17,18,18-Dodecachloropentacyclo-[12.2.1.1^{6,9}.0^{2,13}.0^{5,10}]octadeca-7,15-diene ("Dechlorane Plus"™) – Second draft opinion

The Chair welcomed the Dossier Submitter's representatives from Norway, the RAC rapporteurs as well as the regular and occasional stakeholders. She informed the participants that the restriction dossier had been submitted in April 2021 and summarised the state of play of the opinion-making process.

The Secretariat informed the Committee that RAC had discussed its second draft opinion at the RAC-59 Restriction Working Group and at the RAC-59 plenary and one of the RAC rapporteurs summarised these discussions. Following a question from SEAC members, the RAC rapporteurs clarified that emissions result largely from the waste lifecycle stage. The SEAC rapporteurs then presented the second draft opinion to the Committee.

Members commented on derogations, alternatives, and the status of manufacturing in the EU. SEAC rapporteurs addressed these comments in plenary and no further changes to the opinion in these respects were requested. Members further commented on the cost assessment. Rapporteurs were also asked to elaborate on the impacts that a cease of manufacture in the EU and globally may have on the cost assessment. Members also commented on the benefits and the Dossier Submitter provided clarifying remarks. The Dossier Submitter will check the links to the referenced material to ensure the calculation of benefits is transparent. On proportionality, members requested that rapporteurs consider all available information rather than relying just on cost effectiveness to conclude, and that there is a detailed discussion of the comparison between the different ROs.

The Chair concluded that there was general support by SEAC regarding the scope and derogations as presented by the rapporteurs, pending any further information received via the third-party consultation. Regarding the cost assessment, the Chair concluded that there was general support for the approach taken by the Dossier Submitter. She further concluded that SEAC agrees with the rapporteurs' approach regarding benefits. On proportionality, the Chair pointed to the suggestions for improvements provided by members and asked rapporteurs to elaborate on them for the next version of the opinion.

The (co-)rapporteurs were requested to prepare the third draft opinion by January 2022, taking into account the SEAC-53 discussions, the outcome of the SEAC written consultation and any comments received during the consultation (the deadline for comments is 3 January 2022).

3) Lead and its compounds in ammunition and fishing tackles – Third draft opinion

The Chair welcomed the Dossier Submitter's representative from ECHA, the regular and occasional stakeholders and their accompanying industry experts, invited experts, as well as the members of the SEAC support group which was established to support the rapporteurs in the development of the opinion. She summarised the state of play of the opinion-making process.

The RAC rapporteur informed the Committee that RAC had discussed its third draft opinion at the RAC working group on restrictions, as well as at RAC-59, and summarised the conclusions made. The Dossier Submitter then provided a short update on the planned changes to the draft Background Document. The SEAC rapporteurs presented their third draft opinion to the Committee.

Members commented on the scope and costs of the restriction. SEAC also had discussions on benefits, enforceability and proportionality.

The regular stakeholder observers, together with their experts, commented on costs and proportionality. An occasional stakeholder observer commented on the proposed labelling requirements and on costs. The invited experts supported a time limit for the optional derogation for sports shooting with gunshot and commented on the costs and benefits.

The Chair concluded that there was general support by SEAC on the scope. Regarding the costs assessment, the Commission observer requested that the evaluation consider the reliability of the cost ranges estimated by the Dossier Submitter in additional to central estimates. The Chair concluded that major updates in the Background Document are expected prior to a conclusion on the evaluation of the cost calculations (notably for rifle/pistol shooting ranges), but that SEAC supported the approach taken so far by the rapporteurs (i.e. that estimates costs are likely to be in the right order of magnitude).

Regarding the benefits assessment, the Chair concluded that there was general support for the qualitative elements of the benefits assessment. SEAC also discussed proportionality, affordability and the viability of the optional conditional derogation for sports shooting with lead gunshot, particularly with respect to its enforceability (i.e. record keeping).

The (co-)rapporteurs were requested to prepare the fourth draft opinion by January 2022, taking into account the SEAC-53 discussions, the outcome of the SEAC written consultation and the comments received during the consultation. The Chair reminded that the SEAC opinion development was extended due to the large number of comments received. Further three months extension might be needed in the opinion development, more information will follow in due course.

4) PFHxA – Final opinion

The Deputy Chair welcomed the Dossier Submitter's representative from Germany, the regular and occasional stakeholder observers, and their accompanying experts. He informed the participants that the dossier had been submitted in December 2019.

The SEAC (co-)rapporteurs then presented the draft of the SEAC final opinion and the outcome of the consultation on the SEAC draft opinion (with 161 comments received). Members expressed their support for the SEAC rapporteurs' conclusions, and one member asked how to deal with qualitative assessments in complex restriction cases in the future. The regular and occasional stakeholder observers, together with their accompanying experts, commented on the use-specific analysis for derogations (such as on the performance of fluoropolymers, medical devices and textiles, clothing for rescue workers, coating materials etc.). The Deputy Chair concluded that, pending final editorial changes related to the concerns on the definition of medical textiles and information received in

the consultation on coatings on electronic devices, SEAC supported the modifications to the opinion proposed by the SEAC (co-)rapporteurs.

The Committee adopted its final opinion by consensus. The rapporteurs were requested, together with the Secretariat, to do the final editing of the SEAC final opinion and to ensure that the supporting documentation (Background Document and responses to comments from the consultation) is in line with the adopted SEAC final opinion.

5) Substances in single-use diapers – Final opinion

The Chair welcomed the Dossier Submitter's representatives from France, the occasional stakeholders and the industry experts accompanying occasional stakeholder observers. She informed the participants that the restriction dossier had been submitted in October 2020 and concerns substances in single-use baby diapers.

The SEAC (co-)rapporteurs then presented the draft of the SEAC final opinion and the outcome of the consultation on the SEAC draft opinion. Members expressed their support for the SEAC opinion. A regular stakeholder commented on the potential source of diaper contamination and on aspects of the impact assessment. A second regular stakeholder commented on the uncertainties in the opinion and how they relate to proportionality.

The Committee adopted its final opinion by consensus. The rapporteurs were requested, together with the Secretariat, to do the final editing of the SEAC final opinion and to ensure that the supporting documentation (Background Document and responses to comments from the consultation) is in line with the adopted SEAC final opinion.

5.3 Appointment of (co-)rapporteurs for restriction dossiers (closed session)

SEAC was provided with an update on the upcoming restriction proposals to be submitted in 2022. The Chair informed the Committee that the Secretariat would launch the call for expression of interest for (co-)rapporteurs for the upcoming restriction proposals. The members were invited to volunteer for the pools of (co-)rapporteurs by 31 January 2022.

6) Authorisation

6.1 General authorisation issues

a) Update on incoming/future applications

The Secretariat presented information on incoming/future applications for authorisation and review reports, expected workload in 2022, and timelines.

SEAC took note of the update on the new applications for authorisation received during the November 2021 submission window and other AfA-related updates.

SEAC also took note of the latest updates to the Technical Guidance for SEAC Rapporteurs.

b) Reports on recent studies on substitution

Under this agenda item the Secretariat delivered two presentations: (1) on effects of authorisation on tricholoroethylene, and (2) on dynamic effects of substitution in REACH authorisation system.

On the first presentation, SEAC members discussed both methodology and findings of the survey, such as data extrapolation in the survey based on limited number of responses to the survey, cost of renewal of authorisation, availability of alternatives to trichloroethylene. A representative of the European Commission contributed to the discussion by asking a question on tonnage data extrapolation in the survey.

On the second presentation, SEAC members discussed trends in applicants' non-use scenarios, costs of authorisation system to applicants, overall risk reduction trends as the result of the applications for authorisation system, efforts by applicants towards substitution of SVHCs, as well as methodology of the survey. A representative of the European Commission contributed to the discussion by providing a comment of explanatory nature.

c) Customers' performance requirements – level of evidence needed

The Secretariat presented a document on the evidence needed for customers' performance requirements. During the discussion SEAC members provided comments on the document. Representatives of the stakeholder organisations (ChemSec and ClientEarth) contributed to the discussion.

The Secretariat will update the meeting document according to the discussion in the meeting and will add it to the technical guidance for rapporteurs. The instructions in the application format will also be updated. SEAC members will be invited to send any comments to the Secretariat as they start using it. In addition, the Committee decided that the Secretariat shall schedule a follow-up discussion at the SEAC-55 plenary meeting in June 2022, if required based on the received comments.

6.2 Authorisation applications

a) Discussion on key issues

1. 3 applications for authorisation (chromium trioxide, MOCA) and 2 review reports (TCE) from August 2021 submission window

The Secretariat, in cooperation with the SEAC rapporteurs, provided general information regarding the new applications for authorisation and the review reports, and specified the identified key issues in the applications listed below:

- 242_RR1_TCE_Microporous (single use),
- 243_RR1_TCE_DOMO (single use),
- 244_CT_Cromaplast (two uses),
- 245_CT_Newform (single use),
- 246_MOCA_Courbis (single use).

b) Agreement on draft opinion

1. 232_DtC_Monroe (1 use)

This is an application for authorisation on a single use of dichromium tris (chromate) (DtC):

Use 1: Use of dichromium tris(chromate) in a post-treatment step of the autodeposition coating process of shock absorbers for automotive vehicles.

SEAC members discussed availability of alternatives and substitution activities by the applicant.

The Committee agreed on the draft opinion by consensus. The rapporteurs, together with the Secretariat, will do the final editing of the SEAC draft opinion. The Secretariat will send the draft opinion to the applicant for commenting.

2. 233_CT_Betz-Chrom (1 use)

This is an application for authorisation on a single use of chromium trioxide:

Use 1: Chromium trioxide-based functional chrome plating of components with diverse geometries and dimensions, requiring specialized equipment and process knowledge, for applications in demanding industry sectors such as mechanical engineering, metalworking and processing, aerospace, automotive, and medical technology.

SEAC members discussed the scope of the application, substitution activities by the applicant and its length, suitability criteria by the applicant towards the alternative substance and process, and profit loss calculations in the draft opinion.

The Committee agreed on the draft opinion by consensus. The rapporteurs, together with the Secretariat, will do the final editing of the SEAC draft opinion. The Secretariat will send the draft opinion to the applicant for commenting.

3. 234_CT_Kwalter (2 uses)

This is an upstream application for authorisation on two uses of chromium trioxide:

Use 1: Formulation of chromium trioxide-based electrolyte for electroplating process.

Use 2: Chromium trioxide-based functional chrome plating of cylinders used in the rotogravure printing and embossing industry.

On the draft opinion on Use 1 the SEAC members discussed duties of the formulator covered by this application.

On Use 2 the SEAC members discussed results of the downstream users' survey performed by the applicant and availability of alternatives. A representative of the European Commission contributed to the discussion regarding distribution rate of the new equipment by the applicant to its downstream users and the re-use of the electroplated cylinders by the downstream users.

The Committee agreed on the draft opinions by consensus. The rapporteurs, together with the Secretariat, will do the final editing of the SEAC draft opinions. The Secretariat will send the draft opinions to the applicant for commenting.

4. 235_CA_Neoperl (1 use)

This is an application for authorisation on a single use of chromic acid:

Use 1: The use of chromic acid in the functional electroplating of brass-made sanitary articles with the specific purpose of obtaining a final Cr(0) coating that provides a surface with high durability and chemical resistance.

SEAC members discussed cost calculations by the applicant in the application, availability of alternatives, substitution activities by the applicant, their timelines, applicant's criteria

towards potential alternatives and a length of the review period. In addition, the SEAC members also discussed profit losses reflected in the draft opinion. Two representatives of the stakeholder organisations (ChemSec and ClientEarth) also contributed to the discussion by commenting on the surface quality criteria of electroplated articles.

The Committee agreed on the draft opinion by consensus. The rapporteurs, together with the Secretariat, will do the final editing of the SEAC draft opinion. The Secretariat will send the draft opinion to the applicant for commenting.

c) Adoption of opinion

1. 221_CT_SD_USSK (1 use)

This is an application for authorisation on a single use of chromium trioxide and sodium dichromate:

Use 1: Use of Chromium Trioxide and Sodium Dichromate for Passivation of Electrolytic Tinplate (ETP).

It was received by the Committee in November 2020. SEAC agreed on the draft opinion during SEAC-51 plenary meeting. On 4 October 2021 the applicant submitted comments on the draft opinion.

The Committee adopted the opinion by consensus. The rapporteurs, together with the Secretariat will do the final editing of the SEAC opinion. The Secretariat will send the opinion to the Commission, the Member States and the applicant, and publish it on the ECHA website.

6.3 Appointment of (co-)rapporteurs for authorisation applications (closed session)

The pool of (co-)rapporteurs, as outlined in the restricted room document SEAC/53/2021/04 rev.1 was agreed by SEAC.
