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Summing up

- RAC will not provide reference values in these cases
- RAC & SEAC will evaluate applications based on either 'adequate control' or 'non-threshold' considerations, as appropriate
- Based on previous applications, the 'route' of application does not affect the likelihood that RAC/SEAC will recommend an application
- There are still significant uncertainties associated with a PEC/PNEC approach for EDs
- Adequate control needs to be justified by both the quality of PNECs and the quality of PECs
- RAC may not agree with an applicant's conclusions in relation to adequate control
 - Authorisation can still be granted based on socio-economic arguments

Final thoughts.....

- Minimisation of emissions required regardless of adequate control or SEA route!
- Describe operational conditions, risk management measures (emission control)
- Provide measured emission data
- Justify that the OC and RMM are appropriate and effective in limiting the risk
