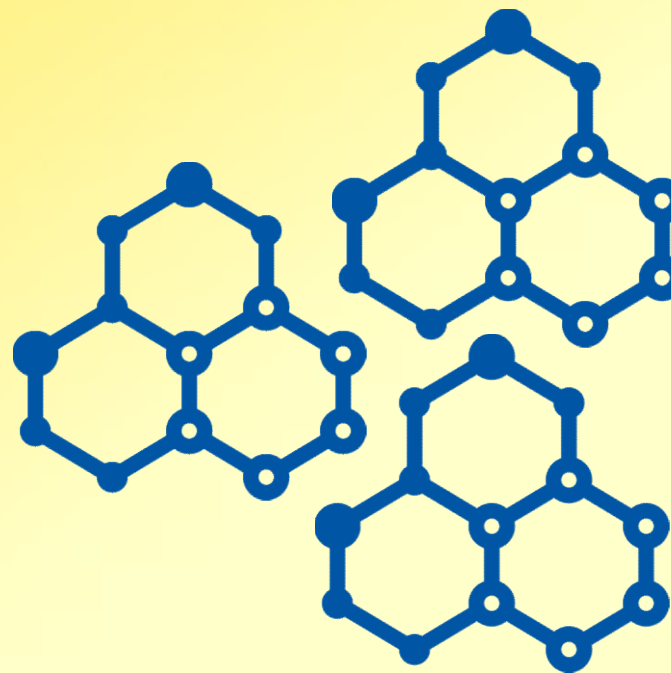

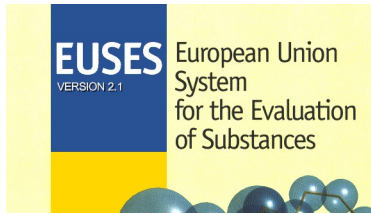

Buy in of stakeholders at all stages

- Covering
 - Specification of required improvements
 - Testing of the improvements
 - Drafting of the manual
- Three types of forum group
 - A broad Expert Group
 - A smaller Preparation Committee
 - Where needed Targeted Topic Groups

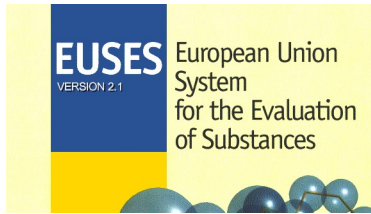


The Expert Group

- Acts as a soundboard
- Covering
 - Authorities
 - Industry
 - Interested stakeholders including academia
- From different backgrounds
 - REACH
 - Biocides
 - Pesticides
 - Fertilisers

The Expert Group

- Informed on the different steps via e-mail
- Invitation to
 - RAC
 - BPC
 - CARACAL
 - EFSA
 - DG JRC
- Will be set-up after the WS, but not becoming active before the pre-study has been finished

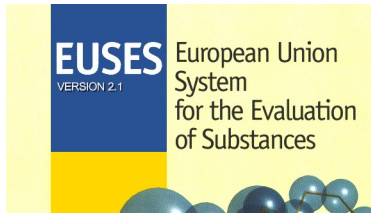


Preparation Committee

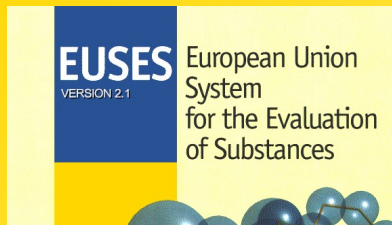
- Decides when the Expert Group needs to be contacted
- Being the link between the developers and the Expert Group and ultimately the broader users of EUSES

Expert Topic Group

- The workshop will result in a list of topics to be included in the ECHA pre-study
- Some topics may require a specific Expert Topic Group (grouping of topics is possible to manage the many issues)
- They will
 - Explore technical aspects
 - Review the technical input to the pre-study
 - Perform focused testing once the project is fully launched
