

Ioannis Dimitrakopoulos

Ioannis Dimitrakopoulos (born 1971) is an Associate Judge (“Maître des Requêtes”) of the Hellenic Council of State.

He obtained his Law degree from Athens Law School in 1993 and his Masters Degree (“D.E.A.”), in the field of domestic public law, from the University of Paris II in 1994.

From 1995 to 1997 he practiced law as a member of the Athens Bar.

In 1998 he graduated at the top of his class from the National School of the Judiciary and was appointed Junior Judge (“Auditeur”) to the Council of State, the Supreme Administrative Court of Greece.

He spent his sabbatical year (2003-2004) as a Senior Fellow at UC Berkeley Boalt Hall School of Law.

During the period 2005-2008 he served as a Senior Legal Adviser/Head of the Legal Team at the office of the European Ombudsman in Strasbourg.

Since 2008, he has been assigned to the second Section of the Hellenic Council of State, dealing mainly with applications for interim measures and actions for annulment in public procurement cases and with appeals in tax, custom duties, unfair competition and trademark cases.

Since 2009, he has been a member of the (three-judge) “Organisation and Planning” Committee of the Court, which deals with various aspects of its management.

In 2010 he was appointed Professor at the National School of the Judiciary, where he has been teaching procedural, EU and fundamental rights law.

His main publications pertain to Community and human rights law.
