

Sari Haukka

Sari Haukka is a Finnish lawyer who has worked for 20 years in the European institutions.

She obtained her Master of Laws and Licentiate of Laws from the University of Helsinki where she later worked as a researcher and teaching assistant. She has also completed her Court training at the District Court of Helsinki.

In 1996 she joined the European Commission where she worked as an administrator. Between 1998 and 2007, she worked as a legal secretary at the General Court of the European Union in the Chambers of Judge Tiili where she carried out legal analyses of cases and drafted judgments concerning different areas within the Court's competence.

In 2007 she joined the European Chemicals Agency as part of the set-up team. She worked as the Registrar of the Board of Appeal from the establishment of the Registry until she began her new role as the legally qualified member of the Board of Appeal in November 2015.

In addition, since 2011 she has acted as the alternate to the Chairperson of the Board of Appeal of the Community Plant Variety Office (part-time function).

She is an experienced lecturer and has frequently spoken publicly on various aspects of European Union law. She has also written several articles, in particular on European procedural and competition law.
