

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# 1. Advice on oversized SCIP dossiers

**SCIP notification statistics** 

One month after the legal duty entered into force, ECHA has already received 6.6 million notifications from around 3 000 legal entities. After the deadline rush, we now see a steady flow of incoming notifications. We invite companies that have not yet started to follow the example of these frontrunners!



#### Dossiers with more than 1 000 components

For dossiers containing more than 1 000 components, as communicated earlier, ECHA has set limits to ensure optimised processing and usability of the data for the waste operators and consumers in order to allow safe use of the articles that have been notified.

All the notifications that have already been submitted with more than 1 000 components are currently in a "pending" status (a very limited number of submissions) and will not be further processed. To solve the issue and successfully finalise the notification, we would request that you re-submit the information and take into account the recommendations in the user manual "Requirements for SCIP Notifications" and the "Key tips for successful SCIP notifications" to simplify your dossier.

If you use system-to-system (S2S) submission, you should also align your IT systems with the requirements set out in the user manual and key tips.

#### Updated support material

The main SCIP user manual "Requirements for SCIP notifications" will be available in 23 official EU languages in the coming days.

Updated system-to-system (S2S) service support material will be available next week to provide recommendations and best practice for successful S2S integration.
