Extension of expiry date for national authorisation – Kvitt Q Superkonsentrat – NO-2018-0147

We refer to the R4BP 3 communication of 21.09.2022 (NRN-C-1611916-03-00/F), concerning the expiry date of the authorisation of the biocidal product Kvitt Q Superkonsentrat containing the active substance imidacloprid. The Norwegian Environment Agency hereby extend the expiry date until 31.03.2023.

Background

Regulation (EU) No. 528/2012 concerning the making available on the market and use of biocidal products (the Biocidal Product Regulation, BPR), is implemented in Norwegian law through the Norwegian Biocide Regulation of 18 April 2017 No. 480.

According to Article 50 of the BPR, an authorisation holder seeking to change any of the information in relation to the initial application of the authorisation of the product shall apply to the Competent Authorities of the relevant Member State having authorised the biocidal product concerned. Those competent authorities shall decide whether the term and conditions of the authorisation need to be amended.

Evaluation

The reference Member State for the re-evaluation, France, has already extended their national authorisation for the biocidal product Kvitt Q Superkonsentrat until 31.03.2023. As a concerned Member State, the Norwegian Environment Agency follows the decision made by the reference Member State.

Decision

The Norwegian Environment Agency hereby confirms that the expiry date of the authorisation granted for Kvitt Q Superkonsentrat has been extended until 31.03.2023 according to Article 50 of Regulation (EU) No. 528/2012 concerning amendment of an authorisation at the request of the authorisation holder.

Apart from the extension of the expiry date outlined above, the authorisation conditions as stated in the authorisation letter dated 14.02.2018 are valid.

No fee will be charged regarding the change of the expiry date.

Appeal

The decision can be appealed to the Ministry of Climate and Environment, in accordance with Article 28 of the Public Administration Act. The complaint must be submitted to the Norwegian Environment Agency within 3 weeks after receipt of this letter, in accordance with Article 29 of the Public Administration Act.
