Covid-19 worldwide health crisis



On 11 March 2020 the World Health Organization (WHO) declared the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak a global pandemic.

The pandemic has caused an unprecedented worldwide health crisis with severe socio-economic consequences and human suffering.

'health crisis' means any crisis or serious incident arising from a threat of human, animal, plant, food or environment origin, having a health dimension and which requires urgent action by authorities;

Covid-19 and the important role of disinfectants



'crisis relevant products' means products and substances necessary, in the context of a health crisis, to prevent, diagnose or treat a disease and its consequences, included but not limited to: [....]; disinfectants and their intermediary products and raw materials necessary for their production.

Main challenges for the Biocides Industry



- Availability of materials, e.g.:
 - Active substances and co-formulants
 - Raw materials
 - Packaging
- Production capacity, lack of workforce
- Borders / Export limitations
- Lengthy biocidal product authorisation procedures
- Non-harmonised regulatory approach across EU (Art 55 of the BPR is MS specific)

"A competent authority may permit, for a period not exceeding 180 days, the making available on the market or use of a biocidal product which does not fulfil the conditions for authorisation laid down in this Regulation, for a limited and controlled use under the supervision of the competent authority, if such a measure is necessary because of a danger to public health, animal health or the environment which cannot be contained by other means"

Biocides Industry activities during the COVID-19 crisis



- Close contact with European Commission (DG SANTE), ECHA and Competent Authorities
- Contribution to OECD discussions at international level
- Identify issues at local, EU and international level and concerns around disinfectants availability
- Calls for action to Commission and Ms:
 - Harmonisation from MSs using Art. 55 of BPR
 - Urging its implementation and coordination
 - Improve the logistics / export situation in EU

Alliances: a key factor in the fight against COVID-19



- ➤ The COVID-19 crisis has forced us to reconsider and look for new ways of working to provide quick and efficient solutions to the problems we are facing.
- ➤ The impact of the COVID-19 pandemic emergency on public health and the social and economic well-being of communities around the planet has highlighted the importance of working in partnership.
- ➤ It has been observed that, in the face of an event of such magnitude, only the coordinated and united work of all actors can offer an effective, equitable and sustainable solution to the health, economic and social crisis.

Appendix 2 lists all the active substances approved or under review for PT1 and PT2 at EU level. Further checks by companies with regards to the efficacy against encapsulated viruses, such as corona viruses should however be conducted.
