Extension of the expiry date for biocidal products containing the active substance indoxacarb

We refer to your email of 31 October 2019, concerning authorisation of biocidal products containing the active substance indoxacarb. The expiry date of the authorisations of the active substance and the products containing them is 31 December 2019.

The Commission has adopted by means of an implementing act, a commission implementing decision on the terms and conditions of the authorisation of the biocidal product in accordance with Article 14 of Regulation (EU) No 528/2012 concerning the making available on the market and use of biocidal products. Regulation (EU) 528/2012 is implemented in Norwegian law through the Norwegian Biocide Regulation of 18 April 2017 No. 480. The decision (COMMISSION IMPLEMENTING DECISION (EU) 2019/1030 of 21 June 2019) postpones the expiry date of approval of indoxacarb for use in biocidal products of product-type 18 until 30 June 2022.

The reference Member State for the re-evaluation, France, has notified the relevant Member States, including Norway, on 16 October 2019 that no re-evaluation of the products containing indoxacarb is possible before the authorisation expires. They have therefor extended the authorisation of these products until 31 December 2022.

Decision:

We hereby confirm that the Norwegian Environment Agency extend the expiry date on authorisations granted for products containing indoxacarb until 31 December 2022 according to Article 50 of Regulation (EU) No 528/2012 concerning amendment of an authorisation at the request of the authorisation holder. The decision applies to the following products:

Advion ant gel (NO-2015-0100)

Advion cockroach gel (NO-2015-0103)

Apart from the extension of the expiry date outlined above, the authorisation conditions as stated in the authorisation letters dated 25.06.2015 (Advion ant gel) and 08.09.2015 (Advion cockroach gel), are valid.



No fees will be charged regarding the change of the expiry date.

Appeal

The decision can be appealed to the Ministry of Climate and Environment, in accordance with Article 28 of the Public Administration Act. The complaint must be submitted to the Norwegian Environment Agency within 3 weeks after receipt of this letter, in accordance with Article 29 of the Public Administration Act.
